

Mandy is actually biased against synthetic fragrances.You don't have to be a fragrance hobbyist or connoisseur to enjoy this book and really benefit from it. I received an early copy of this book to review and before I finished the first section I was already itching for the release date to come so the book could be lent to a friend. It is a lyrical description of what the author calls the five major players in the art of aroma: cinnamon, mint, frankincense, ambergris, and jasmine. The book is partially autobiographical, and I loved the context and history behind all her stories that added richness to her remarks. The author is primarily interested in perfume, but I was more interested in what she had to say about using essential oils in cooking, which is the only reason there isn't a full five stars; this is really a book intended for those who want to know more about how to make their world come alive with scent. The book is easy to read and

flows well (with some clearly marked asides) but there is a lot of information packed into that space. Highly recommended for fans of perfume and anyone who can poke a nose into a rose/fresh-baked loaf/freshly mown lawn and be transported into bliss; recommended with a truly minor reservation for cooks. It is full of ideas rather than recipes, and intended as a guide for learning how the reader can make scent work well for them. Best for readers who are interested in using scent in multiple ways.

Mandy explains that when she is creating a fragrance and all of the various elements finally come together into one cohesive scent, she calls it "locking." And this is precisely what happens with her new book, Fragrant. A "locking" of history, intuition, culture, creation, business, and passion into a seamless volume. For those of us that blithely wear a chosen perfume without thought to its provenance, the book is a revelation. From etymology to recipes to poetry, Fragrant is a richly layered journey, intimate and wise.Have you ever held frankincense in your hand? A nugget of ancient history? It has a particular scent, that I would have never experienced, however Mandy in her creative splendor has produced a beguiling Companion Kit to her book. What would have been a literary adventure into the world of fragrance, was instead visceral treasure for the senses. Brava Aftelier Perfumes!
