

Dave Anderson says that baseball beat writers are "members of a rare and hallowed herd who worked in a rare and hallowed era." Being a baseball beat writer was "the most prestigious, most sought after, most read and most competitive job on a major newspaper."They were the primary source of baseball news, opinion and analysis. But that world no longer exists. Anderson adds, "Men whose careers were rooted in teletype machines and 10-team leagues were the game's last true custodians and guardians, yielding a single influence that would be unthinkable today."Author Dennis D'Agostino interviews 23 long-time baseball beat writers, including nine winners of the Baseball Hall of Fame's J.G.
