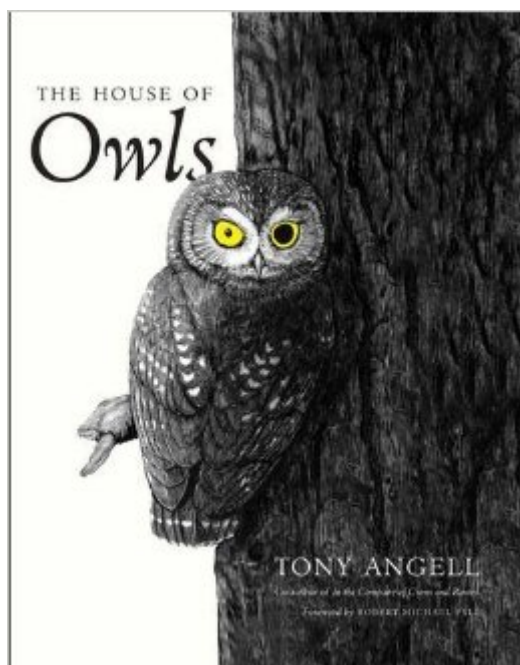

He also offers detailed scientific descriptions of the nineteen species of owls found in North America, as well as their close relatives elsewhere. Always emphasizing the interaction of humans and owls, the author affirms by his own example the power of these birds both to beguile and to inspire.

This book takes my love of owls to new heights with some great insights into what makes these great birds tick. The personal account of the owl family starting up outside his bedroom window would be a dream come true for me. The drawings and sketches help bring these accounts to life. I would recommend this book for any other lover of these magnificent creatures.

I think you have to be a bird/owl lover to like this book. Since I am, I loved it. Lots of information and great pictures drawn by the author. The last part of the book is a synopsis of information about each owl species native to North America. It's dryer than the first part of the book, but I liked getting the information.

This is an odd book, a combination of what is essentially a guide to owls, a venue for Angell's art and a lot of autobiographical detail of a lifetime spent in art and nature (not much about the art, though). Angell's black-and-white sketches have the look of wood block prints, although most seem to be pencil or pen-and-ink. There are lots of illustrations of all the owls. His focus is North America, although some of the owls also have ranges into northern Eurasia. Chapter 2, About Owls, is the most interesting, full of information about various aspects of various owl species. Chapter 3, on owls and human culture, is the weakest chapter, and doesn't say a lot about owls and human culture overall. Chapter 4 discusses owls and people, Chapter 5 looks at owls in unique habitats and Chapter 6 looks at owls of "wild and remote places." I'm not sure about the difference in focus, but these two chapters between them form a good, highly readable nature guide. The range maps are good (also in black and white as are all the illustrations). I don't know if anyone has an interest in doing a study of nature writers, but the portions about Angell's experiences with owls, and a number of personal stories, would be prime material for such a study. I came away with much more appreciation for Angell as a man, naturalist and artist, as well as coming away with a better understanding of owls. He's concerned about the future of some species, partly because of habitat destruction and some because of climate change, but he seems to be hopeful for the future.
